GREENWAY PROJECT BENEFITS

- Adds 27 miles of new 10' wide non-motorized pathway with up to 13 miles directly adjacent to the Grand River
- Acquires 700 acres of new public land
- Integrates new and existing trails to create a 45-mile long cooperative trail system
- Provides direct connection to Millennium Park trails
- Complements river improvement efforts in the City of Grand Rapids, including Grand Rapids Whitewater & GR Forward
- Helps to fulfill Outdoor Adventure goals identified in Grand Action Destination Asset Study
- Connects Grand Haven to Grand Rapids
- Connects Grand Valley State University's Allendale and downtown campuses
- Connects Grand River Greenway lands to each other, as well as to neighboring parks and surrounding communities
- Creates connections to regional trails, including new M-231 Grand River bridge trail
- Integrates biking/hiking trail with existing

GRAND RIVER GREENWAY DID YOU KNOW?

- 8,500 acres of public land between Grand Rapids and Grand Haven
- 20+ miles of public riverfront land on the south side of the river (including 15+ miles in Ottawa County)
- 13 unique parks and open spaces operated by Ottawa County Parks
- 4 universally accessible kayak launches with two more planned for Grand Haven and Grandville

ECONOMIC POTENTIAL DID YOU KNOW?

- Studies show connections and proximity to parks and recreational facilities positively impact property values. A study by the Delaware Department of Transportation found that pathways can increase property values by 4%.
- MDOT recently completed a study which determined that bicycling adds \$668 million to the state economy annually.
